Recipe Box: Leprechaun Pie

Ingredients

2 packages (3 oz. each) cream cheese, softened

1 can (14 oz.) sweetened condensed milk

15 drops green food coloring

24 chocolate-covered mint cookies, divided

2 cups whipped topping

1 chocolate crumb crust (9 inches)

1. In a large mixing bowl, beat the cream cheese until fluffy.

Gradually beat in milk until smooth. Beat in the food coloring.

3. Coarsely crush 16 cookies: stir into the cream cheese mixture.

4. Fold in whipped toppping and spoon into the crust.

Cover and freeze overnight.

Remove from freezerminutes before serving.

7. Crush remaining cookies and use as garnish.
