


Donors Made a Difference



New & Notable

- Rene Ragas joined Woman's as president and chief executive officer in May. Ragas is a Louisiana native with more than two decades of experience as a healthcare executive in the Baton Rouge area and surrounding regions.
- Woman's Board of Directors voted to hire a Chief Diversity Officer as part of an organizational commitment to increase diversity and amplify equity and inclusion on campus and in our community. Learning opportunities on topics of diversity, equity and inclusion were made available to all employees and inclusion training was incorporated into new employee orientation.
- The Guiding Recovery and Creating Empowerment (GRACE) Program, previously only open to pregnant women suffering from opioid misuse, expanded to women who need help with alcohol or tobacco addictions during pregnancy.
- Woman's Connect launched in February, a free app for employees to engage with colleagues and stay updated on the latest news.
- The Breast & GYN Cancer Pavilion rebranded as the Woman's Cancer Pavilion in partnership with Mary Bird Perkins Cancer Center and Our Lady of the Lake Cancer Institute.



Innovation & Accreditation

- Woman's expanded its use of Medtronic's Situate scanning devices to all Labor & Delivery rooms — the first in the area to utilize this safety measure for all patients.
- Interventional Radiology added a radial artery entry site, which provides a less invasive procedure for patients, allowing catheters to be inserted through the wrist instead of the groin.
- Granted full accreditation for all services surveyed by The Joint Commission, demonstrating a commitment to continuous improvement in patient care.
- Fully accredited by the Accreditation of Human Research Protection Programs for dedication to improving the health of patients and the community through research.
- Awarded Bariatric Center of Excellence accreditation from the Clinical Sciences Institute of Optum.
- Maintained Magnet accreditation for nursing excellence by the American Nurses Credentialing Center since 2006.



Awards & Recognition

- Named World's Best Hospitals by Newsweek in 2021 for oncology care and in 2022 for gynecology and maternity care.
- Designated as a Birth Ready+ facility by the Louisiana Dept. of Health, one of only eight facilities in the state to earn this recognition.
- Received Guardian of Excellence Award by Press Ganey for being in the top 5% in the country for patient experience.
- Recognized as a Gift Shining Star hospital by the Louisiana Dept. of Health – Office of Public Health – Bureau of Family Health for achieving rigorous standards of performance, improving the quality of maternity services and enhancing patient-centered care.
- Voted Best Place to Work in Healthcare by Modern Healthcare for the 15th consecutive year, the only healthcare organization to earn the distinction every year since the program's inception.
