- The purpose of this study is to see if two medicines have the same chance to help stop preterm labor and prolong pregnancy at the time you have a cerclage placed. The two medicines are: ibuprofen and indomethacin. Both medicines are taken by mouth.
- Your time in this study will last up to 6 months.
- There is only 1 visit in this study. It will include:
 - Reviewing the informed consent form
 - Collecting information about you: your medicines, your health, your pregnancy
 - Assigning which medicine your doctor will give you after your cerclage placement
 - After you deliver your baby, information from your delivery record will be collected.
- The main risk for taking part in this study is loss of confidentiality.
- If you decide not to take part, there is not another option for this study.
- This study is being done with researchers at Woman's Hospital and the LSU-OB/GYN Clinic. Your study data will be shared with them.
