# Auxiliary Grants Update: "Kidz Kit" Initiative

Many patients express anxiety about how to communicate their cancer diagnosis to their children. The **"Kidz Kit" initiative** aims to alleviate this burden by providing families with resources and tools to facilitate open and supportive conversations about cancer. Each kit includes age-appropriate books explaining cancer, comfort items such as stuffed animals, coloring books, and puzzles, National Cancer Institute and American Cancer Society resources for parents and local support groups and counseling resources.

The Auxiliary awarded a grant of \$2,000 for this program which will allow the Pavilion staff to create 85 – 100 kits.
