## Newborn Vaginal Birth: What to Expect

Welcome to the Mother/Baby Unit at Woman's Hospital. We are dedicated to making your stay as comfortable and reassuring as possible. Our team is here to support you and your family, and we hope you feel at home during your time with us.

As part of our commitment to providing you with the highest quality care and comfort, we want to let you know about some of the activities and services you can expect during your stay.

<b>Activity/Discharge Milestone</b>	<b>Anticipated Time Frame</b>
<b>Orientation to Mother/Baby Unit</b>	<b>Upon arrival to Mother/Baby</b>
<b>Hepatitis B Vaccine Administered (if ordered and desired)</b>	<b>Within 12 hours of birth</b>
<b>Beyfortus (RSV) Vaccine Administered (if ordered and desired)</b>	<b>Prior to discharge (during RSV season)</b>
<b>Birth Certificate Information</b> Information required for Louisiana Birth Certificate	<b>Within 36 hours of birth</b>
<b>Hearing Screening</b> A state required hearing screening for your baby	<b>Between 12 to 36 hours after birth</b>
<b>Cord Clamp Removed</b>	<b>Within 36 hours of age, unless stump is not dry</b>
<b>Car Seat Tolerance Testing</b> Car seat tolerance testing requires you to <b>bring your own car seat</b> . Your baby will be monitored to ensure they can tolerate sitting upright in a car seat if they were born prior to 37 weeks and/or weigh less than 2250 grams. Testing lasts 90 minutes, or the duration of travel, up to a maximum of 3 hours.	<b>Prior to the day of Discharge (if applicable)</b>
<b>Bilirubin Screening for Jaundice</b>	<b>At 36 hours of age or prior if discharged earlier</b>
<b>Newborn Screening</b> Screens for PKU as well as many other metabolic disorders	<b>At 36 hours of age or prior if discharged earlier</b>
<b>Pulse Oximetry Screening for CCHD</b> This is a screening done for critical congenital heart defects	<b>At 36 hours of age or prior if discharged earlier</b>
<b>Meds to Beds (if applicable)</b> Discharge Rx delivered to your bedside by Woman's Retail Pharmacy	<b>Before Discharge</b>
<b>Circumcision (if applicable)</b> Your baby will be observed for at least 2 hours after the procedure for any bleeding, swelling, etc.	<b>Between 24 to 46 hours after birth</b>
<b>AccuCheks (to check blood sugar/glucose, if ordered)</b> Duration depends on reason ordered	<b>Before feedings X 12 to 24 hours of age</b>
<b>Lactation Consult (initial consult)</b>	<b>Within 12 to 16 hours from birth</b>
<b>Car Seat Installed</b>	<b>Prior to day of discharge</b>
<b>Infant Security Tag Removed &amp; Footprint Sheet completed</b>	<b>At time of discharge</b>

**If you have not yet chosen a pediatrician for your newborn who participates in your insurance plan, please select one as soon as possible. This will help us coordinate your baby's care after discharge.** Once your baby's doctor gives a discharge order and they have met all necessary milestones, your baby will be ready to discharge home. In most cases, this occurs within 48 hours after birth if there are no complications.

Please remember that this is only an estimated timeframe and should be discussed with your baby's physician during daily rounds. **Be sure to arrange transportation in advance. If you anticipate anything that could delay your baby's discharge, inform your nurse as soon as possible.**
